



## Articulation Agreement

**Between Red Lake Nation College (RLNC) and White Earth Tribal and Community College (WETCC)**

This agreement is entered into between White Earth Tribal and Community College, 2250 College Road, P.O. Box 478, Mahanomen, MN 56557 and Red Lake Nation College, 15480 Migizi Dr., P.O. Box 576, Red Lake, MN 56671.

### Admission and Graduation Requirements

- A. The receiving institution's admission and graduation requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.

### Transfer of Credits

- A. Students wishing to transfer between institutions must complete a minimum of 12 semester hours at the receiving institution.
- B. Courses will transfer as described in the attached Program Articulation Table.

The following credits will be accepted for transfer between the institutions:

1. Courses with letter grades of "D" or better
2. Courses earned within the past ten (10) years, or
3. Courses earned before the past ten years with academic department approval
4. 100/1000+ level courses (developmental/remedial courses will not transfer)

### Implementation and Review





- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of the agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. The Articulation Agreement is effective on January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018 and shall remain in effect until the end date of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022, unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- C. Both colleges will work with students to resolve the transfer of courses and any changes to either program while the agreement is in effect.
- D. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 (within six months of the end date).
- E. The receiving institution will encode course waivers and substitutions.

F. The sending institution will provide course syllabi, including faculty credentials to the receiving institution.
