WETCC invites applications for its adjunct faculty pool to teach *Beginning Ojibwemowin I*. This 3-credit online course emphasizes learning the sounds of the Ojibwe language, developing introductory conversational skills using grammatical patterns and the double vowel writing system, and understanding cultural lifeways communicated through language.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Tribal eminence in Ojibwemowin or an active teaching portfolio showing relevant teaching experience in the Ojibwe language.
- Commitment to culturally responsive pedagogy
- Experience teaching online courses
