Job Posting: Summer Camp Leader- STEM Transportation Camp

Overview: White Earth Tribal and Community College is seeking students to lead 2 sessions of a summer STEM (science, technology, engineering, math) camp for area youth focusing on transportation. The theme of the camp is using transportation technology to address the future needs of our communities. Join us in making a difference through STEM education and help inspire the next generation of innovators!

Position: Summer STEM Camp Leader- Transportation Camp (2 positions available)

Organization: White Earth Tribal and Community College

Eligibility: White Earth Tribal and Community College students or recent graduates with an interest in STEM and/or childhood education. Experience working with youth is an asset.

Camp Sessions:

- **Session 1:** June 22-25, 2026 (Grades 4-6)
- **Session 2:** July 7-10, 2026 (Grades 7-10)

Contract Duration: June 15 - July 10, 2026

Camp Hours: Monday - Thursday, 9:00 am - 3:00 pm (Camp leaders expected to stay from 8:30 am - 4:00 pm)

Compensation: \$25 per hour for 120 hours (\$3,000)

Responsibilities:

- Lead and supervise camp activities focused on transportation technology and solutions
- Engage and inspire students in STEM learning
- Assist in camp preparation and training prior to camp sessions
- Ensure a safe and respectful environment for all participants

Qualifications:

- Must be a White Earth Tribal and Community College student or recent graduate
- Strong interest in STEM and/or childhood education
- Experience working with youth is preferred
- Excellent communication and leadership skills
- Ability to work collaboratively in a team environment
- Strong organizational skills and attention to detail
- Must pass a background check
